- 2** R/N. Cl. 10-14.1, 20 Any. Metals assorted specialized to buttons with white glass OME. Label metals, construction techniques, and any notable surface designs (cameo, etc.). In memory of Helen Wilt, Hilliard Historian. P. Jean Champoux. \$10, 6, 4; M: \$10.
- 3** R/N. Cl. 20-14, Large. Famous men, no kings. Label men. Larry Everett. \$25, 15, 10; M: \$25
- 4** R/N. Cl. 23-6.3, 15 Large. Specific types specialized to "Gay 90's." (See NBS Blue Book (BB) p. 63 for definition of this subclass.) In memory of Helen Wilt. COBC. \$10, 5, 3; M: \$10.

- 6** R/N Cl. 12-9.5, 25 Any. Synthetic Polymers with Rhinestone/Paste OME. Shirley Boggs. \$10, 5, 3; M: \$10.
- 7** R/N. Cl. 23-6.5, R=20 Any/N=15 Any. Specific Types specialized to movable buttons. No limit on studio buttons. (See BB p. 63 for definition of movables.) Deborah Prader. \$5, 3, 2; M: \$5.

- 8** R/N. Cl. 9-2, 12 Any. Snapette types (snap, pin, clamp, pendant, other). Polk Box Club. \$5, 3, 2; M: \$5

- 16** R/N. 1-0 thru 15-5, 25 Any. Six buttons representing each of the four seasons, plus one button of entrant's choice among the four. Labeling required. Limit of three studios. Cleveland Button Society (CBS). \$10, 6, 4; M: \$10.
- 17** R/N. 1-0 thru 15-5, 25 Any. Five buttons showing nouns that represent each of the following letters: C-B-S-O-H. Labeling required. Limit of three studios. CBS. \$10, 6, 4; M: \$10.
- 18** R/N. Cl. 7-0, Small. Seven buttons of each color: clear, white, pink, red, blue, gray. Mount and label buttons in numerical order. (See NBS Blue Book p. 6 on labeling.) Pam Fouts. \$5, 3, 2; M: \$5.
- 19** R/N. Cl. 7-0, Diminutive (56). Clear and Colored Glass Specialized to diminutives. (See NBS Blue Book p. 6 on labeling.) Carol Morris. \$5, 3, 2; M: \$5.
- 20** R+N Combined. Cl. 8-1, 25 Any. Black Glass mounted in/on metal. Look for various settings and techniques. Chris Graham. \$10, 8, 7; M: \$10.
- 21** R/N. Cl. 9-0, 25 Any. Horn assorted. Doris Scott. \$5, 3, 2; M: \$5.

25 R/N. Cl. 17-0 to 20-24, 25 Any. Assorted pictorials specialized to buttons with images suggesting love or affection, either pictured or implied. Should include at least one button that includes a heart shape in the image or border. Akron. \$10, 6, 4; M: \$10.

26 R+N combined. Cl. 17-0 thru 20-24 and 22-0, 25 Any. Five each Faith, Hope, Love, Luck, and 5 free choice from among the four. Kit Campbell. \$15, 10, 5; M: \$15

27 R/N, Cl, 18-1, 25 Any. Anchors. May include other pictorials, except for humans, but the anchor must be clearly visible. Look for different anchors and materials. Donna Young. \$5, 3, 2; M: \$5.

28 R/N. Cl. 23-10.1.1, 25 Any. Balls (including modified). Materials assorted. Label Materials. Marti Mock. \$5, 3, 2; M: \$5.

29 R/N. Cl. 23-12, Medium-Large. Two buttons with the same design in different materials, such as black glass and metal, pewter and brass, jasperware and metal. Buttons of each pair need not be the same size. Susan Everett. \$25, 15, 10; M: 25.

31 VII A/ VII BB. Cl. 17-0 thru 20-24 + 22-2. Any. Buttons representing childrens' possible career "wannabe's. Think big! Label material and life goal or profession. For example, the image of a musical note could represent a pianist, a conductor, a mezzo soprano, etc. No limit on realistics. In honor of all juniors who try to compete. P.
